- The Haven has 5 hostels, The Haven Wolverhampton refuge service can accommodate a total of 33 families with children and up to 13 single women at any one time
- The Community and Advocacy Support service supported 669 women in 2009-2010

Between April 2009 and March 2010 The Haven received 1731 referrals to its residential service and accommodated 309 women and 277 children.

"Our experiences have provided countless opportunities for knowledge transfer some of which we plan to implement back in Nigeria. These include:

- strengthening counselling services for victims of domestic violence
 providing free legal services for defending the rights of domestic violence victims at police stations and in the Court ;
- supporting groups that advocate passing laws against domestic violence;
 introducing the issue of domestic violence into the State Security
- Committee meetings, which are similar to MARAC;
- •organizing training program for Female Lawyers in Nigeria to strengthen their support for women undergoing domestic violence;
- strengthening advocacy on establishment of Family Courts in relevant
 States and organising training for Judicial Officers and staff members of
 established Family Courts in Nigeria; and
- •increasing support and collaboration with the Children's Parliament to ensure children voices are heard and their rights protected."
