

# **Liverpool John Moores University – Nursing and Midwifery**

## **Eligibility**

We are seeking mid-career midwives and nurses from Uganda. Applicants must have worked as a qualified midwife or nurse for more than three years; two letters of recommendation and future support from their head of department and employer indicating they had contributed towards care initiatives which improved maternal and child health, or patient care. Applicants are asked to provide clear outlines detailing why they should be selected for this programme, what they expected to gain from it and how they would implement their learning and experiences in their working environment
