LifeLine Nehemiah Project (LNP) is a network partner of LifeLine Network International. The partnership has been a rich opportunity for cross-learning and development. We want to apply for a Fellowship for two of the emerging leaders in LNP. The Fellows will complete a 6 week training package that will include; skills training programme, receive 1-2-1 mentoring from the LNI Director and join with local emerging leaders on our bespoke leadership training programme.

Skills training: The Fellows will have hands on training with professionals from the UK team in each of the following areas: project management, fundraising, stakeholder management, as well as personal skills in communication, team work and time management.

The 1-2-1 mentoring with the LNI Director will be bespoke to the needs of the Fellows. Together they will agree a set of learning goals and each week, they will explore what has been learned, new challenges and if the programme needs to be tweaked.

The leadership training programme will be delivered by local leaders and include; psychometric assessment, recognising strengths and building on these, project management, and presentation skills. It will also cover, personal development in areas of communication, working in a team and time management.
