

Imperial College London - Academic

The Imperial Global Development Lab-Commonwealth Academic Fellowship will embed early to mid-career academics from Low-and-Middle-Income (LMIC) Commonwealth countries within host departments at Imperial for 3-month, high-impact placements.

Fellows will collaborate directly with Imperial academic staff on research aligned with their home country development priorities, benefit from access to world-class facilities, and participate in structured professional development. Equally, the Fellowship is designed around relationship-building: through the GDL, Fellows will develop facilitated connections across Imperial's research, innovation, and policy communities, leaving with an active network that continues to generate value after they return home.

Upon return, Fellows are expected to draw on these networks to initiate bidirectional collaborations, bringing Imperial researchers into contact with their home institutions and development contexts. Fellows will introduce new methodologies and approaches; pursue joint publications and grant applications with Imperial colleagues; and mentor junior researchers, creating a multiplier effect on capacity within their institutions and national research ecosystems.

Eligibility

The Fellowship is open to early to mid-career academics employed at universities or research institutions in LMIC Commonwealth countries.

We expect applicants to be no more than ~10 years post PhD. Applicants must have a permanent academic/research appointment at an LMIC based institution, or a contract that extends beyond the date of the Fellowship award (May 2027).

Applicants must be nationals of and reside in an LMIC Commonwealth country, hold a relevant doctoral or postdoctoral qualification, and demonstrate clear alignment between their research area and the priority theme: Science and Technology for Development.

Applications will be welcomed from all eligible LMIC countries, with no geographical sub-restrictions, though applications from under-represented nations and female applicants are particularly encouraged.

We expect applicants to have made prior contact with a research group/ department at Imperial prior to making their application to CSC.
