

Royal College of Emergency Medicine - Professional

This Fellowship will provide Ghanaian Emergency Medicine professionals with an immersive experience in UK emergency care systems, with a focus on leadership, quality improvement, education, service development and research. Fellows will observe and engage with different models of emergency care delivery across NHS settings, gaining practical insights into governance, patient safety, workforce development and system improvement. They will also attend activities such as conference and training days.

The Fellowship is expected to have a significant long-term impact upon the Fellows' return to Ghana, particularly as Emergency Medicine services begin to decentralise nationally to locations outside of the main cities. Fellows will be equipped to become future leaders in Emergency Medicine, supporting the development of high-quality emergency care systems, strengthening training, implementing quality improvement initiatives, and adapting learning from diverse healthcare systems to local contexts across Ghana.

Eligibility

Applicants must be Ghanaian Emergency Medicine (EM) professionals who are either senior residents currently enrolled in EM training, or EM specialists, through the Ghana College of Physicians and Surgeons. Applicants should demonstrate a strong commitment to the development of Emergency Medicine in Ghana and an aspiration to take on future leadership roles within Emergency Medicine departments as the specialty decentralises nationally.

The Fellowship is intended for clinicians actively working within Ghana's healthcare system and committed to applying their learning to strengthen emergency care services, training, quality improvement, and system development upon their return to Ghana.
